

## Quonset Hut March To Fame

To put it in simpler words, a Quonset Hut is nothing but a building structure made up of lightweight metal arranged in the shape of a semicircular cross section extended over a considerable area to shade the ground. The most common form of Quonset Hut is made from iron or stainless steel which is covered with a relatively less reactive metal to protect iron from getting converted into rust which is further bent to give a semicircular shape. The first Quonset Hut was first produced in a small village in the Rhode Island called Davisville at specific location called Quonset Point. Steel gives robustness and flexibility to these structures. In some cases the use of punched or holed sheets was found to decrease weight and increase malleability. Recently PVC players have also ventured into the production of [Quonset huts](#) and have found great success in the wake of their durability and low maintenance.

As it is said that necessity is the mother of all inventions, the need of such a multipurpose and durable structure was felt during the Second World War by the USA naval forces. The apparent utility lied in the ability of easy transport from the place of manufacture to the place of erection and assembly at the preferred location. Most importantly the structure is weatherproof. The applicability of these qualities of Quonset huts could not be ignored by the general public and soon they were used to erect warehouses, stores, shops, garages and even hangars. Quonset huts are inexpensive as compared to traditional construction and take less time to build. Due to the size of the structure it is first manufactured in parts in the factory and later transported to the place where it is required to be put together. However, it may be noted that these metallic structure do not offer much customization over the basic design if one wishes to plant windows etc. Some manufacturers also provide a guide to the assembly of them and they can be easily put to one piece without assistance of skilled labor in this regard. However, while taking orders the manufacturer may allow some alteration to suit the likes and needs of the procurer.

The concept of demand and supply has now crowded the market with large number of enthusiastic merchants of the Quonset Huts. In agriculture oriented economies, these are widely acclaimed since they can be easily erected in farms and put to various uses from protection of crops to harboring of livestock etc. In the modern times this might also emerge as a major housing solution since it is comparatively economical and gives a decent floor area of about 720 meters square to 1200 meters square. The inside of this structure can then be easily partitioned with a compatible material to separate rooms. It can be safely concluded that metal structures have to go far ahead in their journey of fame and popularity with the masses.
